Incorporation of the association
was voted by the 1946 meeting with
Fred Reutzel appointed to act as
chairman of a committee to draw
up application for charter. Due to
some objections expressed to him
in private, he reported that he
had decided it best policy not
to start negotiations for a charter
at the present.

Then the nominating committee's
report was read by Alma Tomlinson,
chairman. Donations were made
and approved by voting to elect
all executive officers for a two
year term so the association
could benefit by experience gained
by the additional year. It was
voted to wait for completion of
the printing of memoirs of the first
three generations before changing
Historians. Alma Tomlinson
remained as Historian. The following
officers elected by acclamation
were:

President: Ernest von Rosenberg
Vice President: Lulu Adams Lodge
Secretary: Lydia J. von Rosenberg
Treasurer: Mary M. Hall

Alma Jamlinson gave a brief talk on the work in progress on assembling the data and memoirs of the first three generations. She reported the work well under way towards completion and promised printed books would be ready for distribution at our centennial year meeting in 1949. She encouraged everyone to purchase a book and each to let her know in advance how many copies wanted.

Invitations were extended from members at Austin and San Antonio for the place of the next meeting. It was voted to have the next meeting in Austin if the Boy Scout Camp or a similar place would be available.
