

**MINUTES - BUSINESS MEETING
VON ROSENBERG FAMILY OF TEXAS**

Saturday, July 18, 1992

Meeting was called to order at 4:00 P.M. by the President, Oscar Paul Lytton. The Pledge of Allegiance was given. Darlyn Bechtol moved to dispense with the reading of the Minutes. Treasurer's report was given by Bill von Rosenberg III, in the absence of the Treasurer, Robert Hein, who was on vacation. It reflected a balance in the operating fund of \$1,716.56 and a total of \$351.99 in the book fund.

Historian's report was given by Dale U. von Rosenberg. The von Rosenberg house at Henkel Square is in disrepair. It was not restored after being used for a movie.

The property is in the process of being transferred from Mrs. Bybee to the University of Houston. He also reported that the Star of the Republic Library at Washington-on-the-Brazos does not have information on the von Rosenberg family.

A copy of each of our four publications will to be sent for their collection. Dale still needs help with Volume III.

MINUTES - BUSINESS MEETING
VON ROSENBERG FAMILY OF TEXAS
Saturday, July 18, 1992

Meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by the President, Oscar Paul Lytton. The Pledge of Allegiance was given. Introductions of everyone present. Darlyn Bechtol moved to dispense with the reading of the Minutes. Treasurer's report was given by Bill von Rosenberg III, in the absence of the Treasurer, Robert Hein, who was on vacation. It reflected a balance in the operating fund of \$1,716.56 and a total of \$351.99 in the book fund.

Historian's report was given by Dale U. von Rosenberg. He went to Henkel Square to check on the von Rosenberg house, which had been reported to be in disrepair. A television crew used it for a movie and it has not been restored. The director of Henkel Square said that part of the problem has been that the property is in the process of being transferred from Mrs. Bybee, who will be 93 on her next birthday, to the University of Houston. A house across the street used to be owned by some von Rosenbergs and it was in disrepair; however, a couple from Houston has bought it and are restoring it. Dale announced that he still needs some people to assist with Volume III. If anyone can help, please let him know. Dale also reported he had received a call from a lady in Ohio who was working on her degree and was looking for letters written by German families. He gave her Robert Hein's name and address and suggested she contact Robert and buy a copy of the immigration letters.

Dale also reported on his visit to the Star of the Republic Library at Washington-on-the-Brazos. They do not have any information on the von Rosenberg family; therefore, Bill von Rosenberg, Jr. moved that we give the library a copy of each of our four publications. The motion was seconded and carried. Dale will deliver the books to the library.

Old business: Edna von Rosenberg asked Jo von Rosenberg to give the report on the cookbook project. Jo reported that August 31st is the absolute deadline for recipes. They would particularly like any German recipes you may have. Also, please indicate which branch of the family you belong to. They are also interested in any ideas on how the book should look and what information about the family should be included.

Darlyn Bechtol reported on the T-shirts. She still has plenty of children's shirts for sale; also, some small and medium adult sizes. If there is enough interest in the larger adult sizes, she can reorder.

New Business: The President asked for a motion on next year's Reunion. There was a discussion on the cost of meeting at Camp Lone Star. Glenn von Rosenberg reported that this year the Camp is charging \$71.00 per adult and \$51 per child. We are not been able to work out the deals with the Camp which we did in the past because their costs have increased and they have a waiting list of families wanting dates. However, the Camp has a plan whereby if we prepay our estimated cost in February, we can

receive a 10% discount. This would mean that we would need approximately \$3500-4000 from family members who would be willing to lend us the money from February until the Reunion in July. Glenn also discussed membership and how we can improve our attendance. The Camp has a total of 104 beds; we are using approximately 62 this weekend.

Roger von Rosenberg moved that we come back to Camp Lone Star next year and try to get the prepayment made. Motion was seconded and carried. Glenn asked that anyone interested in helping with the prepayment to come by and talk to him tonight.

Nettie Green showed some ceramic coffee mugs which have been made with the Family crest and name on them. These were obtained through a cousin whose brother works for a ceramics company in East Texas. There was a \$30.00 one-time charge for the drawing, which is good for three years from the date of the last order. She had 200 cups made for the initial order and is selling them for \$3.00 per cup or two for \$5.00. This company makes a variety of ceramic and plastic items, so Nettie would appreciate any ideas on other items we might want imprinted.

MEMORIAL SERVICE AND DEVOTIONAL SERVICE
