


This year's Saturday morning's



"Grave Witching" is destined to please, but will undoubtedly raise a few eyebrows, particularly, among those, who subscribe to the scientific method. It is recommended that

one start with an open frame of mind and allow faith to be your guide.

The morning tour will start at 9:45 am in the Assembly Room at the Johnson Retreat Center of Camp Lone Star and proceed by an automobile to the "Old" and "New" Town Cemeteries in La Grange. We will be introduced to four gravesite locations of the 1849 Franziska vR emigrants, namely, the ancestral father, Peter Carl vR and three of his children, Johannes Carl vR, Branch III; Amanda Karoline vR Meerscheidt, Branch V; and Carl August Walter vR, Branch VII. Besides these four, there are numerous other important family members buried nearby including spouses of the aforementioned and a myriad of their descendants. Among these are Arthur Meerscheidt, devoted husband, father and son-inlaw and his daughter, Martha Meerscheidt, first Historian of the von Rosenberg Family



of Texas. After introductions, there will be a brief demonstration of "grave witching" that uses conventional dowsing rods, which are

right-angled, metal wire often handmade using only a pair of pliers and metal clothes

Arriving from Schulenburg/I-10

Take State Hwy 77 north from Schulenburg to La Grange (about 17 miles). As you reduce your speed while descending into La Grange from the "Bluff", you will encounter a number of highway "S curves" on that approach. As you reach the bottom of the "Bluff" and before you cross the Colorado River bridge into La Grange, make a hard right (east) onto Camp Lone Star Road.

Special Notes

Camp Lone Star Road meanders for about two miles as a tree-shaded lane to the entrance at Camp Lone Star. Once inside the camp grounds, stay to the right on the main road and proceed past the Camp Office but do not stop. A short distance past the office will be a parking area to your left camouflaged by a forest of trees. Turn here into the parking lot via one of two entrances.

Once parked, take the concrete sidewalk that follows the hillside down to the Johnson Retreat Center. The entrance door from the parking lot is an unceremonious approach into the Center. The first room to be encountered inside is likewise uneventful and houses Ping-pong tables. Proceed straight ahead through a doorway into a hallway that leads back to the Assembly Room where you will find "Registration and Reception". 

Wingo.

As we all know, our von Rosenberg forebears made a fateful decision in the fall of 1849 which took them from their ancestral East Prussian home of over 200 years and brought them to the wilderness of mid-Nineteenth Century Texas. The impetus for this en-masse migration has been explained with references to the Family being "freidenkers", to use the parlance of the time, but what does that mean?

This much we know; to be a "freidenker" was to be a "free-thinker", something that by the very sound of the term evokes outsider status and something other than the norm, which when one thinks about what the von Rosenberg Family stood for in terms of its rank in the Kurlandic nobility and general status in the aristocratic hierarchy of Nineteenth Century Europe, seems quite strange.

In today's sociopolitical climate, to be a "free-thinker" doesn't simply conjure up the world of political thought, it also encompasses broader realms such as religion and spirituality, and specifically, the more left-leaning components of those subject matters. Some might even go so far as to describe a modern "free-thinker" as being synonymous with an atheist and/or a communist. So, were our ancestors, who have factually been described as "free-thinkers", in fact godless socialist sympathizers or worse? In short, my answer to that question is a definitive NO, because that is not what a "free-thinker" was then.

To fully comprehend why I think this and what the term "freidenker" actually meant at the time the Family emigrated, one must look further back to the environment in which they lived and how it evolved in

the months, years and even decades before they boarded the Franziska in Bremen in October, 1849.

Our von Rosenberg ancestors were creatures of their time; especially the patriarch, Peter Carl Johann von Rosenberg and his two eldest sons, Carl Wilhelm and Johannes Carl. And that time was a time of revolution throughout Europe, even in the isolated enclave of Memel at the very northern tip of the Prussian Kingdom. It was this atmosphere of revolution and reaction that forged the minds, hearts and behaviors of those who came before us, and to understand them, one must understand their history.

Over the next few months, and at our President's request, I will be drafting a position paper on what it means to call our von Rosenberg ancestors "free-thinkers" and I will have copies of the paper for review at our July reunion. 




